

Every day I get at least twenty emails from campaigns, and almost as many text messages. It's exhausting. I research many of these candidates, and there are also organizations whose judgment I trust. Indivisible is one of those organizations.

National Indivisible has selected three Democrats in the primaries. Two of these candidates have been significantly outraised, and the third is a critical upgrade. The three are

- Jasmine Clark (GA-13).
- Peggy Flanagan (Minnesota Senate)
- Brad Lander (NY-10)

Georgia State Representative [Jasmine Clark](#) is running against octogenarian incumbent David Scott, whom Indivisible politely described as so "ineffective" he was removed from Ranking Membership on his committees. He has not voted in the last six elections (including for Kamala). I will be less polite than Indivisible. Scott is senile. We cannot afford Democrats cognitively unable to perform, and the failure of leadership and Scott's own staff to force him to retire is part of our problem.

[Peggy Flanagan](#) is the sitting Lieutenant Governor of Minnesota, running to replace Tina Smith, who is retiring. She is endorsed by Smith, Tim Walz and has a history of progressivism. Her primary opponent is Rep. Angie Craig. Craig is the favorite of Chuck Schumer and close to AIPAC. Her fund pitches center on Republican hostility to her same-sex marriage. I don't think this identitarian focus meets the moment.

[Brad Lander](#) is running in NY-10 against incumbent Dan Goldman. Honestly, Goldman is a better congressman than one might expect from his billionaire background. AIPAC dislikes him. His voting record is progressive. But he didn't endorse Zohran Mamdani in the mayor's race, while Lander (then the NYC Comptroller) served as Mamdani's most active Jewish supporter and shield. That deserves serious credit.
